Utah AEF provides ROTC scholarships

The AEF Programs provide scholarships to the three college AFROTC units in the State of Utah; BYU, University of Utah, and Utah State University. We also provide scholarships to five High School Junior AFROTC units within Utah. Additionally, the Foundation supports the auxiliary efforts of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP), by providing funding to the Utah CAP Head Quarters and to qualified CAP squadrons.

AFA's CyberPatriot Competition

Utah AEF supports the AFA's CyberPatriot Competition, a National Youth Cyber Education Program. The competition puts teams of high school and middle school students in the position of newly hired IT professionals tasked with managing the network of a company. Teams compete for the top placement within their state, and qualification for national competition. The top teams in the nation earn allexpenses paid trips to Baltimore, MD for the National Finals Competition, recognition and scholarship awards. Of the 20 fastest growing careers, 15 of them require a background in math or science.
